

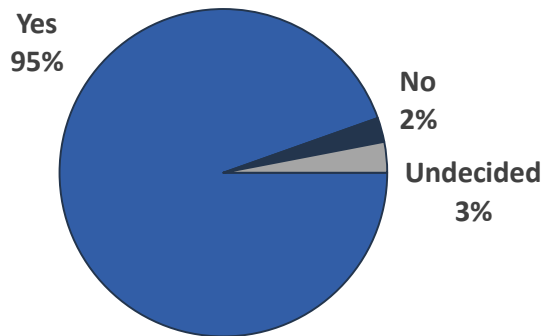

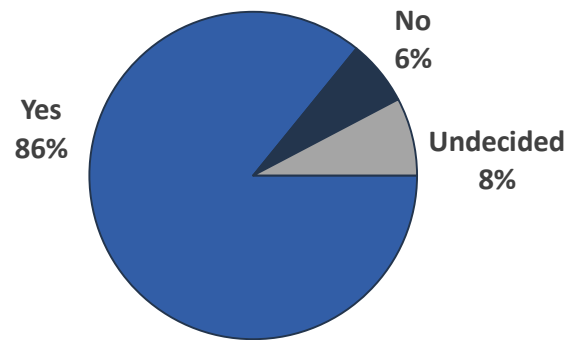


2020 Legislative Survey Results

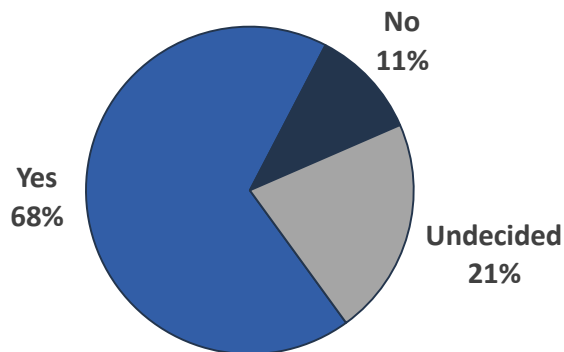
