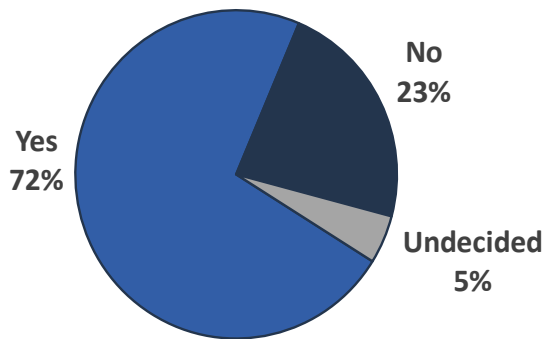

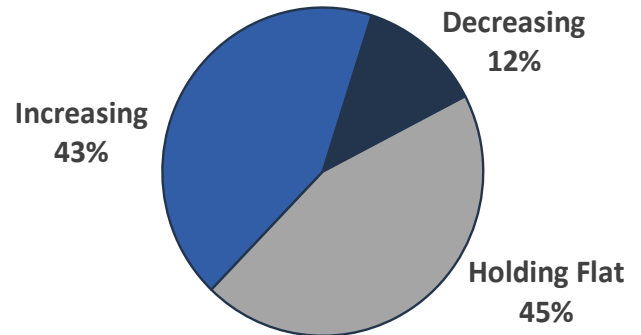


2020 Legislative Survey Results

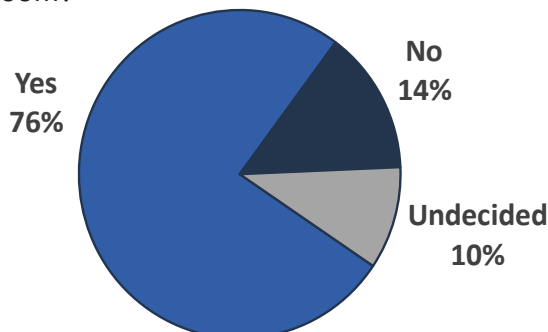
1. Would you support raising the age to purchase tobacco and vaping products to 21?



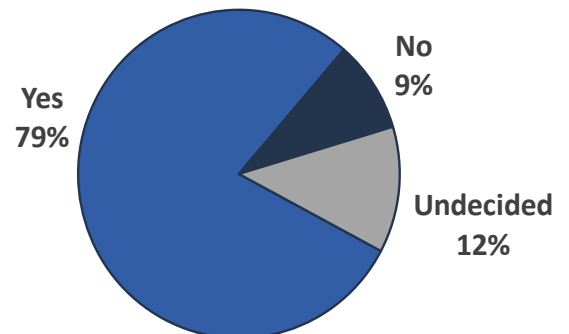
2. The state sends a total of \$7.3 billion in education funding directly to local schools – this figure does NOT include federal and local property tax dollars schools receive. This amount averages to over \$6,800 per student. The \$7.3 billion in state funding can be used for whatever educational purposes the school desires. Do you support increasing, decreasing or holding flat state education funding?



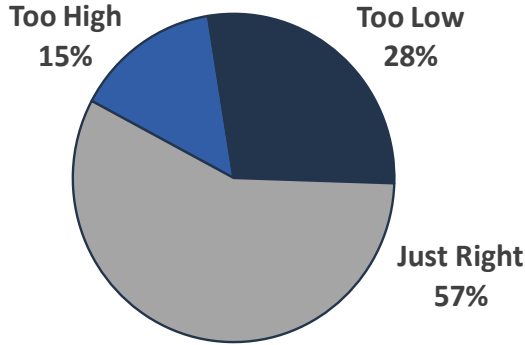
3. According to the latest analysis, on average less than 60 percent of public school funding makes it to the classroom for things such as teacher salaries and instructional technology. This means that more than 40 percent of school expenditures are going toward items like corporation administrators, and operation and maintenance of facilities. Would you support legislation that would require increasing the amount of public school expenditures that go to the classroom?



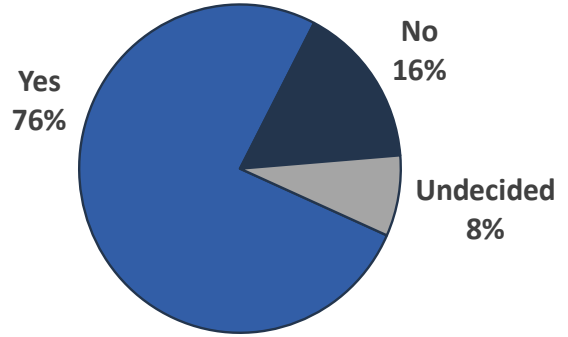
4. Indiana is 1 of only 13 states with a AAA credit rating, which is the highest possible rating. Would you agree that Indiana has done a better job of managing its finances than most other states?



5. Indiana currently has about \$2.3 billion in its savings account. This amount would run state government operations and local schools for about 51 days, or 14 percent of the year. Do you believe the amount of money in Indiana’s savings account is too high, too low or just right?



6. Currently, most units of local government, like schools, must buy newspaper advertising space for certain announcements, like budgets. Do you believe posting this information online as well as in a public building should replace this sometimes costly public notification requirement?
