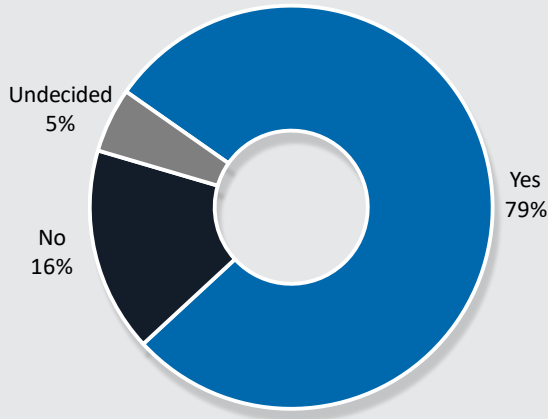


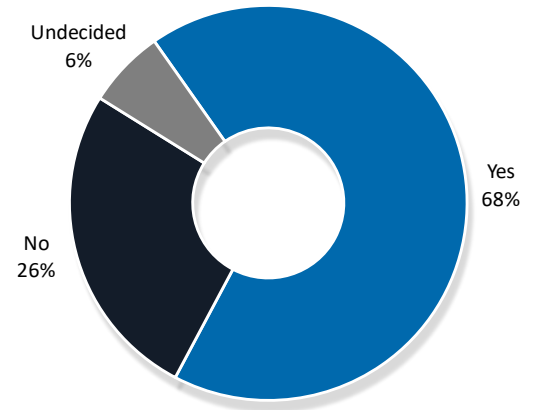


State Representative Jerry Torr 2019 LEGISLATIVE SURVEY RESULTS

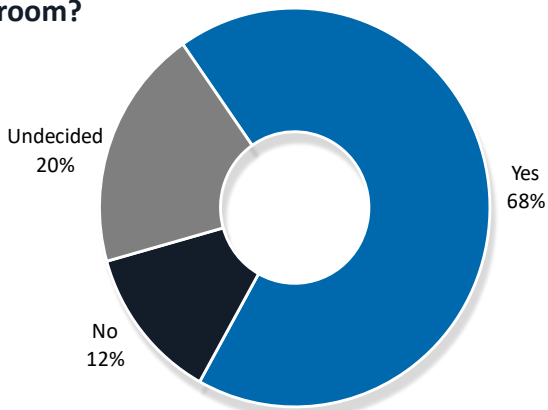
1. Would you support raising the state tax on tobacco?



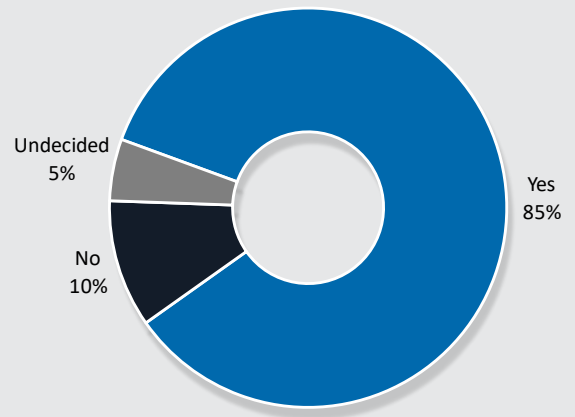
2. Do you support the legalization of medical marijuana?



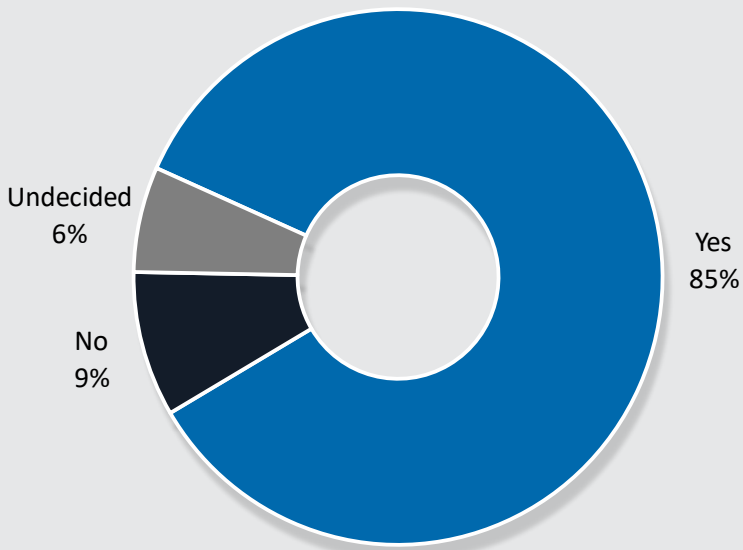

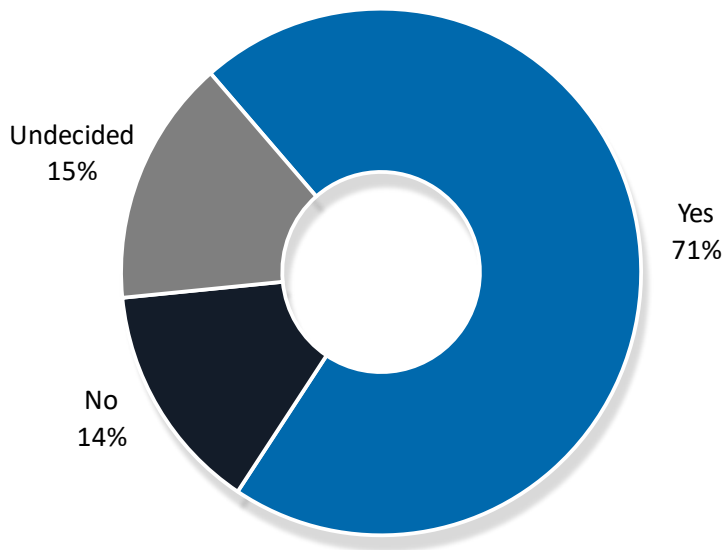
4. Indiana provides a \$100 tax credit to educators for out-of-pocket school supply expenses. Do you believe this credit amount should be increased?



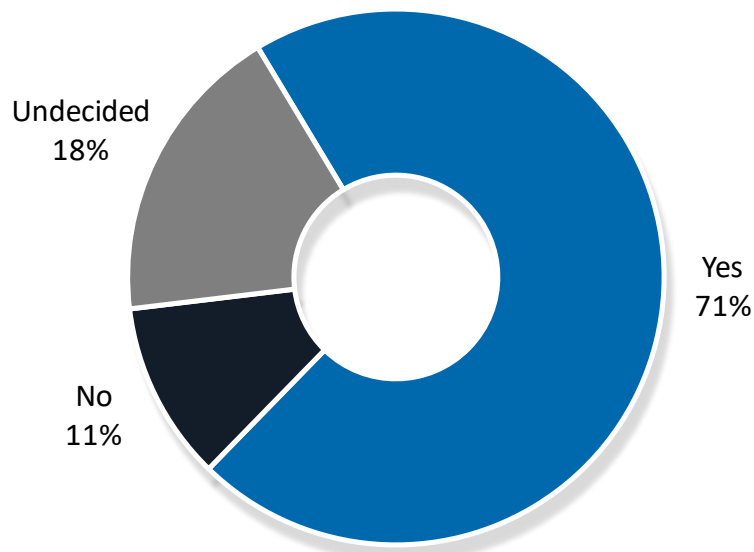
